This Forgotten Land

Our speaker for January will be Don Hakenson. Some of you may have met Don in September, when he and Chuck Mauro spoke to us about the new documentary they are co-producing, "Mosby's Combat Operations in Fairfax County."

This month, Don will tell us about his experiences researching his latest book, *This Forgotten Land, Volume II: Biographical Sketches of Confederate Veterans Buried in Alexandria, Virginia.* The book is his attempt to identify, record, and document the military histories of Alexandrians who served in the Confederate Army and Confederate Navy, and he uncovered the stories of many fascinating people in the course of his research.

Don is the past president of the Stuart-Mosby Historical Society and he has spent countless years researching obscure Civil War incidents in Fairfax County, especially those relating to John S. Mosby and his rangers. He received the 2001 Nan Netherton Award for *This Forgotten Land, Volume I*.

Don will have copies of his books available for purchase.

Change in Meeting Schedule Proposed

Minutes of the Herndon Historical Society Meeting Wednesday, 17 November, 2010 ArtSpace, Herndon Virginia

Carol Bruce, President, called the meeting to order at 7:40 p.m. There were 8 persons in attendance including the speaker.

- **I. Approval of Minutes from the 22 September 2010 Meeting:** Minutes approved unanimously.
- **II. Treasurer's Report:** Richard Downer presented the Treasurer's report. As of this date, Total Assets are \$9,291.25. This includes \$3,708.75 in the Society's checking/savings account, \$5,552.50 in the Northern Virginia Community Foundation-HHS fund, and \$30 in petty cash. - **III. Old Business:** Carol Bruce clarified that Barbara Glakas had requested that the Society consider buying a brick to support the Herndon High School athletic field improvement program, and reiterated her suggestion that the Society needs to purchase a new Open sign for the Depot. (Barbara had a conflict and was unable to attend.)

Virginia clarity reported that she had not heard back from Clete Wood as to whether he would be willing/able to restore the wooden Museum sign that was recently damaged.

IV. New Business: Carol reported that Barbara Glakas has followed up on the Coleman family cemetery behind Herndon Middle School. She has spoken to a member of the county Cemetery Preservation Association, and her goal is to see that the plot is cleaned up and improved.

V. Announcements:

Carol Bruce reported that the November 6 Keith Rocco opening reception, which the Society sponsored, was a successful and very enjoyable event.

Carol also reminded those in attendance that the annual model train show was set for December 11 and 12, and noted that she still needed help staffing the Depot on Saturday the 11th. Virginia Clarity and Margaret Cyrus volunteered to take the morning shift.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:50 p.m., after which the members enjoyed a presentation by Richard Downer on the artwork of Keith Rocco.
